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The purpose of this document is to provide you with information about my qualifications, practice, and the rights you have, as the client of a registered intern under Oregon Law (ORS 675.755 and OAR 833-050-0020).

My theoretical perspective stems from a family systems framework, and includes a relational, strength-based approach drawing from techniques from Solution Focused Therapy as well as Emotion Focused Therapy. My goal is to help individuals, couples and families grow through the challenges set before them, using the struggles they face as a stepping-stone for opportunities to heal and live more authentically.

I hold a Master's degree in Marriage Couple and Family Therapy from Lewis & Clark College. As a Registered Intern of the Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists, I will abide by its Code of Ethics. As an Intern, I am supervised by Brittany Boney, LMFT, and Jessica Thomas, LMFT.

Fees: \$100 per session unless you have made a sliding scale agreement with the therapist.

As a client of an Oregon Registered Intern you have the following rights:

- *To expect that a licensee has met the qualifications of training and experience required by state law;
 - *To examine public records maintained by the Board and to have the Board confirm the credentials of a licensee;
 - *To obtain a copy of the Code of Ethics (Oregon Administrative Rules 833-100);
 - *To report complaints to the Board;
- To be informed of the cost of professional services before receiving services;
- *To be assured of privacy and confidentiality while receiving services as defined by rule or law, with the following exceptions: 1) Reporting suspected child abuse; 2) Reporting imminent danger to you or others; 3) Reporting information required in court proceedings or required by insurance company; 4) Providing information concerning licensee case consultation or supervision; and 5) Defending claims brought against me;
 - *To be free from discrimination because of age, color, culture, disability, ethnicity, national origin, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, marital status, or socioeconomic status.
